What is the new route number for US 41?

The American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials (AASHTO) and the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), will select the Interstate route number in the Fall of 2012 based on the following guidelines:

- Major Interstate routes are designated by one- or two-digit numbers (e.g. I-94)
- Routes with odd numbers run north and south (e.g. I-39)
 - The lowest numbers begin in the west (e.g. I-5)
- Routes with even numbers run east and west (e.g. I-90)
 - The lowest numbers begin in the south (e.g. I-10)
- Loop routes carry a three-digit number. These route numbers are designated with the number of the main route and an even-numbered prefix (e.g. I-894)
- Spur routes, connecting with the main route at one end, also carry a three-digit number, using the number of the main route with an odd-number prefix (e.g. I-794)
